




Novel coronavirus SARS-CoV-2 by NIAID-RML

Strategies to Prevent COVID-19 in Long-Term Care

- RESTRICT visitation
- Communicate with residents & families
- Restrict non-essential HCP
- Educate HPC
- Practice social distancing of residents
- Monitor HCP and residents for fever and symptoms of respiratory infection
- Implement infection prevention and control practices
- Notify health department and other facilities
- Assess inventory and provide necessary supplies
